Join In Celebrating a Special Night of JubanoJazz Music with Klezmer Company Orchestra

For Maestro Aaron Kula, nothing beats leading the Klezmer Company Orchestra, especially when he can share some of his favorite fusion of Latin and Jewish music - JubanoJazz. On April 26, he will get to do both, as he and the Klezmer Company will take the stage for a one night only concert event in North Miami Beach. The 3 p.m. event on April 26 will spotlight "JubanoJazz!" a unique fusion of sounds that blend Klezmer melodies with Latin percussion and Afro-Cuban rhythms. The nine-member ensemble will also perform Mambo, Salsa, and Tango dance beats using traditional Yiddish songs from the past 100 years. KCO tours nationally and internationally and is led by Kula who is a veteran lecturer, conductor, and composer. "This new music is exciting and brings people from all different cultures together in song and dance," Kula said. "We are excited to bring this party to Miami where there is a prominent Latin and Jewish presence in the region." Proceeds from the concert at the Julius Littman Theater will be used to help provide services to children affected by child abuse. Dr. Marc Greenfield, who leads the Children's Survival Network, a non-profit dedicated to improving the lives of abused children, is jubilant about the upcoming concert and what it means to his organization. "First and foremost, I'm looking forward to hearing this amazing music, which is a thrill," Greenfield said. "But most of all, it will set the tone for what we hope will be a great 2015. So you can have a great time dancing the night away and make a difference at the same time." The Littman Theater, at 17011 Northeast 19th Ave., will be host to the concert from 3 to 6 p.m., with tickets starting at \$18.
